Maths

In Maths this term, we are focusing on multiplication, division and fractions.

We will be learning to:

- recall and use multiplication and division facts for the 3, 4 and 8 multiplication tables.
- write and calculate mathematical statements for multiplication and division using the multiplication tables that they know, including for two-digit numbers times one-digit numbers, using mental and progressing to formal written methods
- solve word problems
- recall whole, half, quarter, three-quarters and thirds of fractions.
- count up and down in tenths.
- recognise, find and write fractions.
- recognise and use fractions as numbers.
- recognise and show, using diagrams, equivalent fractions with small denominators
- add and subtract fractions with the same denominator within one whole [for

example,
$$\frac{5}{7} + \frac{1}{7} = \frac{6}{7}$$

- compare and order unit fractions, and fractions with the same denominators
- solve problems that involve all of the above

<u>Unit Topic - History:</u>

We will be looking at Victorians.

- The children will be looking at events beyond living memory (within the Victorian Era)
- Significant turning points in the Victorian era

Design and Technology:
