
## Amazing Authors — Chris Riddell

Chris creates picture books for younger children too! He has won many of the top children's book prizes, including a Smarties Gold Award and the rare honour of two Kate Greenaway medals. 



"This was a groundbreaking book about race and gender when it was first published, and it remains an absolute standard - brilliantly told with superb artwork."



After all, everybody deserves to have something good in their life at least once.


